# **COVID-19 Risk Template – Junior & Senior Infants**

(List identifies COVID-19 as the hazard and outlines control measures required to deal with this risk)

Covid-19 is a new illness that can affect your lungs and airways. It is caused by a virus called Coronavirus. Symptoms can be mild, moderate, severe or fatal.

Also reminded to catch coughs and sneezes in their elbow. # Wearing of Gloves

When dealing with matters of First aid wearing gloves, masks and aprons/visors if required.

# PPE

Children and teachers will follow guidelines laid out by the Department of Education. Masks and/or visors must be worn by staff if closer than 2m and may be worn by or children in they opt to do so.

## **Health Check Questionnaire**

Prior to the start of school, parents and teachers will complete Return to Work and Health Check Questionnaire.

# **Entering Buildings**

Children will go straight into their classrooms. Principal, Learning support teachers and SNAs will monitor this where possible. Doors will need to be propped open for entry and to remain open, and windows on either side of the classroom to remain open as much as possible to assist through ventilation to classrooms.

# Exiting Buildings

Senior Infant class will leave the school through the gate at the side exit (by Health Centre) at 1:05pm.

Junior Infants Class will leave through the main gate entrance at 1.05pm.

Social distancing to be maintained during exit

Names on children's belongings so that items don't get mixed up or misplaced.

# Schoolbags

- no school bags are allowed. Children will only need to bring in a lunch bag (see below).

Their pencil classes will be left in their box (see below).

#### Boxes

 a box per child will be provided and placed under their chair to store their individual books/resources/pencil case/lunch etc. • The children will remain in their pods.

- Parents will complete a questionnaire at the beginning of school to confirm that their child is well and has not, to the best of their knowledge, come into contact with covid-19
- Parents will be asked to inform the school if there is any change in the condition of their child.
- Children to be reminded on a daily basis of the importance of social distancing both in the school and outside of it. – Staff check to ensure this is adhered to. 1m markings on playground at each gate to assist lining up
- Children will walk out to meet their parents. If parents are collecting at the gate they will be asked to stand on the 2m markings that have been painted outside the gate.

#### Clothes

Children wear shoes and clothes that they can manage independently (e.g. elastic trousers, velcro shoes).

# A change of clothes

In case of toileting accidents a change of clothes should be brought in at beginning of term and left in box.

# Homework

Where applicable, homework books/worksheets will remain at/ or be sent home. Children must upload pictures of their Homework on ClassDojo or Seesaw.

#### Corrections

Where applicable, teachers collect books on Friday, where appropriate, to quarantine over the weekend before marking Monday. Where work must be marked in person by the teacher, rotating copies to be used for each consecutive week.

# Classroom library books

Each child may have a book for the week from the class library in their box (if advised by teacher) and on Friday they would be removed and held over the weekend so they could have new books for the following week.

## **Lunch Boxes**

Children will only need to bring in a lunch bag (disposable where possible) each day that can fit in their box. Children having lunches that they can open and manage themselves without any assistance. Lunch leftovers to be taken home at the end of each day for disposal.

# Eating/Break Times

- Prior to eating children will wash their hands pod by pod to avoid over-crowding and cross-contamination by sinks door stops to be used in bathrooms so that these sinks can be used. Teacher/SNA to pre tear off hand towels that can be used and binned. Paper towel bins will be located outside the toilet and door handles will be wiped down regularly.
- Children will have to remain seated at their desks for the entirety of eating lunches
- If weather is good and children are eating outside, children will sanitise rather than wash hands.

- Teachers will source and label boxes.
- Pencil cases and books kept in school and of a wipeable material

- Notes will no longer be sent home from school in children's journals. Parents can contact teachers via Aladdin, school email address, Seesaw or ClassDojo.
- Teachers will use their laptops to correct homework and classwork if necessary. Work can be photographed within the classroom.

Staggered break times will be necessary to enable children to remain in their pods and maintain social distancing

#### Readers

- If applicable, reading groups will be assigned a reader for a week, which is brought back in on Friday, put in a box over the weekend and given to next group on Monday. Children who want to read more can borrow an extra library book which is quarantined for min 3 days on return, wiped down and issued weekly after 72 hours quarantine

Cleaning of children's desks and chairs at the end of the day.

<u>Shared equipment</u> – items can be shared within in pods where applicable but where possible, children will have individual materials/equipment. All shared items will be disinfected/quarantined before use by another pod. Children to keep their own materials (pencils etc. in their box)

- Removal of soft toys, cushions, carpets from the classroom area. These materials to be stored away.

# Cleaning

Frequently cleaning and disinfecting objects and surfaces that are touched regularly particularly in areas of high use such as door/window handles, light switches, blinds, hand-towel dispensers, sanitiser dispensers, desks and chairs using appropriate cleaning products and methods.

## Well-Being

The Well Being and readjusting to school will be the primary focus of teachers going back to school, emphasis will be on this as opposed to academics at the beginning of term. Allow the children opportunities to discuss their feeling/ideas and time spent at home. Each classroom should have a class plant or worry tree to promote a positive classroom environment.

# Symptoms of Covid-19

- If anyone becomes unwell with a new continuous cough or a high temperature, they will be taken to the isolation room and procedures laid out by the Department of Education will be followed.
- If advised that a teach, child or parent or connected member of public has developed Covid-19 and were recently on our premises the School Management

• Equipment and all classroom areas will be wiped down regularly but more thoroughly on Friday afternoons.

- Checks will be carried out by staff to ensure that the necessary procedures are being followed and records kept at check times.
- Teachers and SNAs to clean and disinfect high use items on a regular daily basis.
